# **HIRC Transparency Badge**



## What

A customer-facing recognition of suppliers who have met the criteria.

## Value

Increase healthcare resiliency. Foster partnership, transparency, and trust.

#### How

- 1. Upload L1 and L2 geographic data and emergency contact to SRS or Peer Supply
- 2. Complete Business Continuity Maturity (BCM) Assessment via SRS or Peer Supply
- 3. Choose "Share with all HIRC provider members"
- 4. Complete an attestation and submit notification to HIRC
- 5. Get the badge / Get recognized / Provide a quote



## **HIRC Mapping Standard**

## Step 1 Upload L1 and L2 geographic data and emergency contact to SRS

#### What

The <u>standard</u> defines Level 1 and Level 2 geographic information. Scope must include all value stream locations for "essential and critical" products and services, as interpreted by the supplier.

Minimum: city/state and product family Preferred: address and UNSPSC Scope: US market (including any global locations that feed the US market)

Value

Increase visibility, proactivity, and coordination

How

Contact Supply Risk Solutions (<u>SRS</u>) and load the appropriate scope of information per the <u>standard</u>. Attribute product categories and indicate an emergency contact.

## Step 2 Complete BCM Assessment via SRS

#### What

The Business Continuity Maturity (BCM) assessment is a <u>standard</u> assessment of the preparedness of a trading partner to resist and recover from disruptions. Business Continuity Maturity (BCM) is a programmatic structure to effectuate resiliency at an organizational level. The BCM Assessment is derived from ISO 22301, takes roughly 1 hour to complete, and rolls up to 5 different levels of maturity. It enables a better understanding of preparedness.

Value Increase risk awareness and mature mitigation



#### How

Complete the self-assessment online via <u>SRS</u>. Upon completion, you decide which customers (none, some, all) can view the result. SRS aligns with the HIRC standard.

## Step 3 Choose "Share with all HIRC provider members"

#### What / How

To be eligible for the HIRC Transparency Badge, you need to choose to share the BCM and mapping information with "all HIRC provider members" via <u>SRS</u> or Peer Supply.

## Step 4 <u>Complete an attestation and submit notification to HIRC</u>

#### What / How

Copy/Paste the following attestation and email to <u>HIRC</u> Please provide the **list of product families** included in your location sharing.

"I attest that [Company] meets the criteria for the HIRC Transparency Badge as outlined in the process and standard, and that I have the authority to make this attestation on behalf of [Company].

[Company] intends to maintain its eligibility status and will notify HIRC if choosing to withdraw.

If there is a material error in my attestation, [Company] will work to remedy in good faith. If not remedied in a reasonable time frame, I understand that the badge may be revoked.

L1 and L2 information is now available to HIRC providers for the product families specified below. I (have / have not) provided a quote."



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## Step 5 Receive badge

Upon review, HIRC will recognize qualifying suppliers by:

- Add supplier logo to "HIRC Transparency Partner Badge" recipients slide.
  Slide will show internally during monthly HIRC member calls.
- Email supplier with image file of the badge and acknowledgement.
- Highlight supplier in Journal of Healthcare Contracting publication (May 2023)
- Designate supplier as badge recipient on refresh of HIRC website as a public facing acknowledgement (May 2023)

## Step 6 <u>Provide quote</u>

For Journal of Healthcare Contracting and HIRC recognition (May 2023)

- Why has your company chosen to meet the HIRC Transparency Badge requirements?
- What is your posture on resiliency and your go-forward commitments?

Feel free to express creatively, yet concisely. Quotes from leadership are welcome.
